

Terms of Trading

(Terms and Conditions of Sale - version effective as of 4 June 2025)

With Eurosonic Group Limited

(the "Terms")

1. Business customers and consumers

- 1.1 Some of these Terms apply to consumers only; some apply to business customers only. Those terms are marked as such.
- 1.2 All other terms apply to all customers.
- 1.3 References to "you" or "your" in these Terms means the person or entity identified in the relevant purchase order. References to "we", "us" or "our" herein means Eurosonic Group Limited, or if different, the supplier of the goods and/or services identified in the relevant purchase order.
- 1.4 You are classified as a business customer if you indicate to us that the goods supplied by us will be used in the course of your business or if you use the goods in the course of your business.
- 1.5 If you are not a business customer, you are a consumer. You have certain statutory rights as a consumer which are not affected by these Terms. Contact your local trading standards office for more information. Words in bold type are legal words which clarify, rather than alter, the meaning of the relevant clause.

2. Price

- 2.1 The price quoted excludes VAT (unless otherwise stated). VAT will be charged at the rate applying at the time of delivery.
- 2.2 Our quotations lapse after 30 days (unless otherwise stated).
- 2.3 The price quoted excludes delivery (unless otherwise stated).
- 2.4 **Business customers:** unless otherwise stated, the price quoted to business customers is an illustrative estimate only and the price charged will be our price current at the time of delivery.
- 2.5 **Business customers:** rates of tax and duties on the goods will be those applying at the time of delivery.
- 2.6 **Business customers:** at any time before delivery we may adjust the price to reflect any increase in our costs of supplying the goods.

3. Your sales activities

- 3.1 We may at any time, at our sole discretion, communicate to you <u>recommendations</u> as to the resale price for the goods from time to time.
- 3.2 You may, without our prior written consent, appoint any person or entity to sell the goods purchased pursuant to these Terms for onward sale (**Sub-Reseller**), provided that, and you acknowledge and agree that, you shall be liable for all acts and omissions of any of your Sub-Resellers as if they were your acts and omissions.

- 3.3 You shall not, and shall procure that your Sub-Resellers shall not, use any platform the purpose of which is to connect merchants and potential customers with a view to enabling direct purchases (being online marketplaces) including but not limited to Amazon and eBay, to resell the goods.
- 3.4 Notwithstanding clause 3.2, if a Sub-Reseller breaches the restriction set out in clause 3.3, we may, without prejudice to our other rights and remedies, require you to immediately:
 - 3.4.1 cease use of the Sub-Reseller under or in connection with this Agreement; and/or
 - 3.4.2 cease the supply of goods purchased under these Terms to that Sub-Reseller for onward sale.

4. Delivery

- 4.1 All delivery times quoted are estimates only.
- 4.2 If we fail to deliver within a reasonable time, you may (by informing us in writing) cancel the contract, however:
 - 4.2.1 you may not cancel if we receive your notice after the goods have been dispatched; and
 - 4.2.2 if you cancel the contract, you can have no further claim against us under that contract.
- 4.3 If you accept delivery of the goods after the estimated delivery time, it will be on the basis that you have no claim against us for delay (including indirect or consequential loss or increase in the price of the goods).
- 4.4 We may deliver the goods in instalments. Each instalment is treated as a separate contract.
- 4.5 We may deliver in quantities of 10% more or less than the quantity ordered and charge you for the quantity actually delivered.

5. Delivery and safety

- 5.1 We may decline to deliver if:
 - 5.1.1 we believe that it would be unsafe, unlawful or unreasonably difficult to do so; or
 - 5.1.2 the premises (or the access to them) are unsuitable for our vehicle.

6. Delivery and risk

- 6.1 The goods are at your risk from the time of delivery.
- 6.2 Delivery takes place either:
 - 6.2.1 at our premises (if you are collecting them or arranging carriage); or
 - 6.2.2 at your premises (if we are arranging carriage).
- 6.3 You must inspect the goods on delivery. If any goods are damaged (or not delivered), you must write to tell us within seven working days of delivery (or the expected delivery time). You must give us (and any carrier) a fair chance to inspect the damaged goods.

7. Payment terms

7.1 You are to pay us in cleared funds prior to delivery unless you have an approved credit account.

- 7.2 **Business customers:** if you have an approved business credit account, payment is due within 30 days of our invoice date (unless otherwise agreed in writing).
- 7.3 If you fail to pay us in full on the due date:
 - 7.3.1 we may suspend or cancel future deliveries;
 - 7.3.2 we may cancel any discount offered to you;
 - 7.3.3 you must pay us interest at the rate set under s.6 of the Late Payment of Commercial Debts (Interest) Act 1998 calculated (on a daily basis) from the date of our invoice until payment; compounded on the first day of each month; and before and after any iudament (unless a court orders otherwise):
 - 7.3.4 we may claim fixed sum compensation from you under s.5A of that Act to cover our credit control overhead costs; and
 - 7.3.5 we may recover (under clause 7.9) the cost of taking legal action to make you pay.
- 7.4 If you have an approved **business** credit account, we may withdraw it or reduce your credit limit or bring forward your due date for payment. We may take any of these actions at any time and without notice.
- 7.5 **Business Customers:** you do not have the right to set off any money you may claim from us against anything you may owe us.
- 7.6 **Consumers:** you may only set off money you claim from us against money you owe us with our written agreement and on such terms as we may state.
- 7.7 While you owe money to us, we have a right to keep any property we may hold of yours until you have paid us in full (a lien).
- 7.8 You are to indemnify us in full and hold us harmless from all expenses and liabilities we may incur (directly or indirectly and including finance costs and legal costs on a full indemnity basis) following any breach by you of any of your obligations under these Terms.
- 7.9 **Consumers:** clause 7.8 means that you are liable to us for losses we incur because you do not comply with these Terms. We may claim those losses from you at any time and if we have to take legal action, we will ask the court to make you pay our legal costs.
- 8. Title
- 8.1 **Consumers:** your statutory rights are unaffected.
- 8.2 **Business customers:** until you pay all debts you may owe us:
 - 8.2.1 all goods supplied by us remain our property;
 - 8.2.2 you must store them so that they are clearly identifiable as our property;
 - 8.2.3 you must insure them (against the risks for which a prudent owner would insure them) and hold the policy on trust for us;
 - 8.2.4 you may use those goods and sell them in the ordinary course of your business, but not if: a) we revoke that right (by informing you in writing); or b) you become insolvent.
- 8.3 **Business customers:** you must inform us (in writing) immediately if you become insolvent.

- 8.4 **Business customers:** if your right to use and sell the goods ends you must allow us to remove the goods.
- 8.5 **Business customers:** we have your permission to enter any premises where the goods may be stored:
 - 8.5.1 at any time, to inspect them; and
 - 8.5.2 after your right to use and sell them has ended, to remove them, using reasonable force if necessary.
- 8.6 Despite our retention of title to the goods, we have the right to take legal proceedings to recover the price of goods supplied should you not pay us by the due date.
- 8.7 You are not our agent. You have no authority to make any contract on our behalf or in our name.

9. Warranties

- 9.1 We warrant that the goods will:
 - 9.1.1 comply with their description; and
 - 9.1.2 be free from material defect; for a period of 12 months from the date of delivery (as long as you comply with clause 9.4).
- 9.2 **Business customers:** we give no other warranty (and exclude any warranty, term or condition that would otherwise be implied) as to the quality of the goods or their fitness for any purpose.
- 9.3 **Consumers:** the warranty in clause 9.1 is in addition to your statutory rights.
- 9.4 If you believe that we have delivered goods which are defective in material or workmanship, you must:
 - 9.4.1 inform us (in writing), with full details, within 7 days of the defect becoming apparent; and
 - 9.4.2 allow us to investigate (we may need access to your premises and product samples).
- 9.5 If the goods are found to be defective in material or workmanship (following our investigations), and you have complied with those conditions (in clause 9.4) in full, we will (at our option) replace the goods or repair the goods free of charge.
- 9.6 Where we are not the manufacturer of the goods or parts, our liability is limited to any benefit which we may receive under any guarantee given by the supplier of the goods or parts.
- 9.7 We are not liable for any other loss or damage (including indirect or consequential loss, financial loss, loss of profits or loss of use) arising from the contract or the supply of goods or their use, even if we are negligent.
- 9.8 Our total liability to you (from one single cause) for damage to property caused by our negligence is limited to two million pounds.
- 9.9 For all other liabilities not referred to elsewhere in these Terms our liability is limited in damages to the price of the goods.
- 9.10 Nothing in these Terms restricts or limits our liability for death or personal injury resulting from negligence.

10. Specification

- 10.1 If we prepare the goods in accordance with your specifications or instructions, you must ensure that: the specifications or instructions are accurate; goods prepared in accordance with those specifications or instructions will be fit for the purpose for which you intend to use them; and
- 10.2 your specifications or instructions will not result in the infringement of any intellectual property rights of a third party, or in the breach of any applicable law or regulation.
- 10.3 We reserve the right to make any changes in the specifications of our goods which are necessary to ensure they conform with any applicable safety or other statutory requirements.
- 10.4 **Business customers:** we also reserve the right to make without notice any minor modifications in our specifications designs or materials as we think necessary or desirable.
- 10.5 All sketches and designs provided by us are private and confidential. You must return originals and any copies to us on demand.
- 10.6 Unless otherwise stated, all specifications, drawings, weights and measurements are illustrative only.

11. Return of goods

- 11.1 We will accept the return of goods from you only:
 - by prior arrangement (confirmed in writing) and quoting your Return Authorisation Number (RAN);
 - 11.1.2 on payment of an agreed handling charge (unless the goods were defective when delivered) and
 - 11.1.3 where the goods are as fit for sale on their return as they were on delivery.

12. Export terms

12.1 Where the goods are supplied by us to you by way of export from the United Kingdom Clause 12 of these Terms applies (except to the extent that it is inconsistent with any written agreement between us). The 'Incoterms' of the International Chamber of Commerce which are in force at the time when the contract is made apply to exports, but these terms prevail to the extent that there is any inconsistency. Unless otherwise agreed, the goods are supplied ex works our place of manufacture. Where the goods are to be sent by us to you by a route including sea transport we are under no obligation to give a notice under section 32(3) of the Sale of Goods Act 1979. You are responsible for arranging testing and inspection of the goods at our premises before shipment (unless otherwise agreed). We are not liable for any defect in the goods which would be apparent on inspection unless a claim is made before shipment. We are not liable for any damage during transit. We are not liable for death or personal injury arising from the use of the goods delivered in the territory of another State (within the meaning of s.26 (3) (b) Unfair Contract Terms Act 1977).

13. Cancellation

- 13.1 If an order is cancelled (for any reason) you are then to pay us for all stock (finished or unfinished) we may then hold (or to which we are committed) for the order.
- We may, without prejudice to any other rights and remedies that we may have, suspend or cancel an order (including all orders in force and subject to these Terms), by written notice if:
 - 13.2.1 you fail to pay us any money when due (under the order or otherwise);
 - 13.2.2 you become insolvent;

- 13.2.3 you fail to honour any of your obligations under these Terms.
- 13.3 You may not cancel the order unless we agree in writing (and clauses 4.2.2 and 13.1 then apply).

14. Waiver and variations

- 14.1 Any waiver or variation of these Terms which are incorporated into existing orders is binding in honour only unless:
 - 14.1.1 made (or recorded) in writing;
 - 14.1.2 signed on behalf of each party; and
 - 14.1.3 expressly stating an intention to vary these terms.
- 14.2 Subject to clause 14.1, we may update these Terms from time to time. The version of the terms in force and effective at the time you place your order with us will apply to that order. Please check the terms each time you make a purchase.
- 14.3 All orders that you place with us will be on the version of these Terms as incorporated into your order with us, as referred to above. By placing an order with us, you are expressly waiving any terms you may have and these Terms shall apply to the exclusion of any other terms that you seek to impose or incorporate.

15. Force majeure - business customers only

- 15.1 If we are unable to perform our obligations to you (or able to perform them only at unreasonable cost) because of circumstances beyond our control, we may cancel or suspend any of our obligations to you, without liability.
- 15.2 Examples of those circumstances include act of God, accident, explosion, war, terrorism, fire, flood, transport delays, strikes and other industrial disputes and difficulty in obtaining supplies.

16. General

- 16.1 English law is applicable to any contract made under these Terms. The English and Welsh courts have non-exclusive jurisdiction.
- 16.2 If you are more than one person, each of you is liable for all of your obligations under these Terms (joint and several liability).
- 16.3 If any of these Terms are unenforceable as drafted:
 - 16.3.1 it will not affect the enforceability of any other of these Terms; and
 - 16.3.2 if it would be enforceable if amended, it will be treated as so amended.
- 16.4 We may treat you as insolvent if:
 - 16.4.1 you are unable to pay your debts as they fall due; or
 - 16.4.2 you (or any item of your property) becomes the subject of: a) any formal insolvency procedure (examples of which include receivership, liquidation, administration, voluntary arrangements (including a moratorium) or bankruptcy); b) any application or proposal for any formal insolvency procedure; or c) any application, procedure or proposal overseas with similar effect or purpose.

- 16.5 **Business customers:** all brochures, catalogues and other promotional materials are to be treated as illustrative only. Their contents form no part of any contract between us and you should not rely on them in entering into any contract with us.
- 16.6 **Business customers:** any notice by either of us which is to be served under these Terms may be served by leaving it at or by delivering it to the other's registered office or principal place of business. Proof of delivery must be obtained and all such notices must be signed.
- 16.7 No contract will create any right enforceable (by virtue of the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999) by any person not identified as the buyer or seller.
- 16.8 The only statements upon which you may rely in making the contract with us are those made in writing by someone who is (or whom you reasonably believe to be) our authorised representative and either:
 - 16.8.1 contained in our estimate (or any covering letter) and not withdrawn before the contract is made; or
 - 16.8.2 which expressly state that you may rely on them when entering into the contract.
- 16.9 Nothing in these Terms affects or limits our liability for fraudulent misrepresentation.

17. Data Protection

17.1 Please note that we may transfer personal information about you to those we may appoint to administer your account or recover amounts owing. That may include, for example, passing information about you to our insurers, debt recovery agents and solicitors, if you fail to pay us."
